The January meeting, Beginning Astronomy, has had a larger audience than other meetings, so it will be held this year at the public library. Other sites may be used for that meeting over the next few years.

We don't know what situation we'll be facing at Washburn after the renovation; we'll cross that bridge when we get to it. Nor do we know exactly when that time will be.
